# message from OUR PASTOR

By the time you read this newsletter, there will be a decision about the next president of the United States. I hope there is an acceptable transition of power underway no matter who



the winner of the election is, and we can say goodbye to the election anxiety that often comes with a presidential election. We live in what seems to be quite divided times in our nation, and that division seems to always peak during an election cycle. I want to encourage everyone here at St. Paul's that during times like these, we express our unity as the body of Christ. The body of Christ includes people with all sorts of different beliefs throughout the world, and we are encouraged by Peter and Jesus to submit ourselves to our earthly authorities no matter who is in power.

When speaking about whether the Jews should pay taxes to Rome, Jesus says, "Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's." When Jesus says this, he is avoiding arrest and a riot, but he is also telling us something important. During the time of Jesus's ministry, God's people were living under a governmental authority that was not their own, and there was much discourse about what the Messiah was meant to do. Many thought he would be a military leader who would come and destroy an earthly oppressor. In this case, this oppressor would be Rome; however, instead he came to destroy an even bigger oppressor, and that oppressor is the devil and sin itself. Jesus is telling us that no matter who is ruling on earth, God is ruling in heaven. The money we have may be valuable on earth, but it is useless in heaven. He says to give the money back to Caesar, it has his face on it anyway, and to give your heart to God because that is what matters most.

I am not going to say elections are not important and we should not participate in them. I think the opposite. We should vote in every election; however, Psalm 146 says, "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation. When his breath departs, he returns to the earth; on that very day his plans perish." Our politicians are not deserving of our faith. In the end, they will always fail us. They will die and perish just as we do. They will fail us because they are human and are fallen as much as anyone and they will let us down and will lead us away from salvation.

Instead put your faith in Jesus Christ, the King of Kings, the Lord of Lords. He will bring us salvation and guide us home to heaven. He will not perish, and he will always endure for us. 

LORD OF LORDS.




Pastor Jim as Martin Luther nailing the 95 Theses to the church door



How quickly this month has flown by as always for this time of year. The Holiday Bazaar was a smashing success and All Saints Sunday is almost upon us as I write this article. For November I wanted to share some recent additions to the Archive courtesy of Charles and Judy lager. Since we are celebrating Pastor Jim, Hanna and Eden's first year anniversary, it is most fitting that I have an article from Charles and Judy about another graduate pastor called by St. Paul's.

### St. Paul's Calls Graduate Pastor

Theodore Menter, son of Mr. and Mrs. Menter, of Pemberville, Ohio was among the graduates of Theological Seminary at Capital University, Columbus Ohio, on June 6, has been called as pastor at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Fulton

He will be ordained into Lutheran Ministry on June 13 in Bethlehem Lutheran Church in his hometown, and will attend the Eastern District Convention of the American Lutheran Church from June 21-25, arriving here on June 25, to take up temporary residence at 1014 Phillip Powers Drive, Laurel, pending construction of a new parsonage.

The new minister will be installed at St. Paul's Church on Sunday, June 27, at 3 p. m. and all neighboring congregations have been invited to attend the services. There will be no morning worship services at the church on this day.

The Reverend Albert Horn, of Baltimore, will deliver the installation sermon and the Reverend Richard Hefner, of St. John's Church, Pfeiffer's Corner will act as liturgist.

Mr. Menter was graduated from Capital University in 1950 and interned at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Berea, Ohio from September 1952 to September 1953. He is married to the former Margaret Hurdelbrink, of Pemberville, Ohio, and they have one son, David, age 2.

Ground will be broken for the new parsonage, which will be located adjacent to the church, immediately after

the morning worship service on June 13, with the Rev. Albert R. Horn of Baltimore, officiating.

The 9-room, 2-story, stone dwelling, which will match the church, will be constructed by James O. Williams of Brunt Mills.




